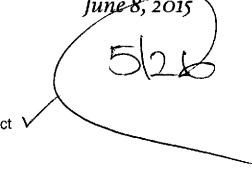

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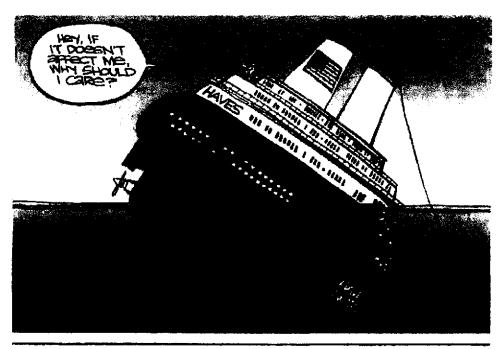

Attached is a couple pages that reviews the pros and cons of the District's sale of the property to MTDH. (I apologize for the unwieldy nature of the document. I initially started it in excel because I was going to do a side by side pros/cons discussion, but the logical trail didn't end up working that way.) So, this is a set of issues that I think are worth considering in deciding on a sale vs. a lease. I believe that the preponderance of the issues leads to the conclusion that a sale is preferable. I think the key issues are that the value of the improvements at the conclusion of the lease that would typically revert to the lessor's (District) ownership are likely to be minimal, and a lease arrangement is likely to make it more difficult for MTDH to obtain financing to fund the new RHC development. Lenders tend to get antsy when the borrower does not control beyond the term of a land lease the property upon which the improvements they are funding have been constructed. In other words lenders care about their collateral, and if the borrower doesn't control the land then that tends to devalue their collateral.

And finally, although I've not done any analysis to determine what a fair market lease revenue steam would be, I can confidently suggest that it would not be a lot. The lease revenue stream would merely compensate the lessor for its cost of equity capital (only what we call the systematic risk components of the risk free rate + market risk premium). This systematic risk element is generally around 5-6% these days. Then there would be risk element associated with the District's lost opportunity costs associated with the land being tied up in a lease arrangement. But that additional risk element would arguably be 0%+/- given the fact that one has to consider upside and downside potential when quantifying that risk element. So when one considers that should the District sell the property and then have the freedom to reinvest those proceeds, the systematic risk element is removed from the equation since that component of the lease revenue stream would wash with what the District earned on those funds in an investment scenario. Therefore the only real upside element of a lease revenue stream to be considered would be the opportunity cost element which, although often favoring an upside risk therefore being quantified as a positive factor in the lessor's favor, is still not likely to be any significant amount.

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Sell the Angel's Camp Property - Evaluation of Pros and Cons

Pros

- 1 Insulate from Downside Market Risk District is not in land speculation business
- 2 District benefits by 1/2 from any Upside market benefits given 1/2 ownership in reserve fund
- 3 Typical benefit of ownership of improvements at conclusion of lease not a factor in this case since improvements consist of non-profit RHC (1/2 of which the District already owns by virtue of afformentioned reserve fund) the value of which is likely to be immaterial.
- 4 Property sales price to MTDH would make District whole on its investment assuming that MTDH purchase price = District original purchase price.
- Terms of the existing lease agreement (District as lessor, MTDH as lessee) stipulates that at lease termination, capital asset additions in excess of \$100k must be repurchased by the lessor.

 Accordingly, the District would have to buy back the land (presumably at original purchase price).

 Consequently, the District will end up owning (and controlling) the land again anyway should that lease temination event materialize which is unlikely in any case.
- Any available lease revenue stream would likely be minimal since the property would revert to the District at the termination of the property lease thereby returning market value upside potential to the District. The only thing that a lease revenue stream should compensate the District for would be lost upside market potential in the interim (i.e. short term market upside potential), however given the highly speculative nature of such a notion (including the offsetting downside potential that also must be considered), such property lease revenue stream has little potential, hence the reason most land leases are at a \$1.00 per year + some measure of cost of capital associated with the land investment principal.

- 7 Cost of capital premium would be minimal given minimal opportunity cost associated with District's land investment (i.e. average annual return on District's invested funds). Assuming land ownership reverts to District and termination of land lease, District would still benefit from speculative upside (and downside) potential at lease termination.
- 8 Lease arrangement would likely impair the clinic's ability to attract financing. Lenders would prefer that the Clinic/Hospital entity own the land.
- 9 An alternative might be to lease-to-own. In other words, the land remains on the District balance sheet but an agreement would transfer the land to the Hospital at the conclusion of the lease with lease payments totalling the purchase price. From a lender's perspective, this would be preferable to a straight lease deal whereby at the conclusion of the lease the land reverts to the District's control.

Cons

- 1 Eliminates Upside Market Benefits
- 2 If "highest and best use" eventually proves to be something other than RHC, District would forfeit upside potential associated with greater "highest and best use."
- District could benefit from lease payments should the property be leased. Although there is not a lot of potential for a lease revenue stream given the minimal current market rate cost of capital and the fact that property value opportunity cost is limited to that which would be achievable during the term of the lease, land leases typically include a slight premium over and above those two factors.
 Such premium would likely be minimal but would nonetheless not be available to the District should the property be sold instead.

4 Benefits of property control relinquished during term of lease thereby precluding District from taking advantage of any market opportunities in the interim.

Legislative Updates

ACHD is pleased to announce that on May 28, 2015, the Assembly voted to adopt <u>ACR 69 (Chavez)</u> and declare May 2015 as Healthcare District Month. **ACR 69** recognizes the essential role Healthcare Districts play in the communities they serve throughout California. The Legislative Session is about half way over, with the fiscal committee deadline passing on May 29, 2015, and the house of origin deadline on June 5, 2015. All bills must pass out of their respective houses by the deadline to continue moving forward this year. Find an update on all legislation with an ACHD position here and Hot Watch bills here. ACHD 2015-16 State Budget Updates

The Legislature is currently in the midst of budget negotiations, with the looming constitutional deadline on June 15, 2015. The Budget Conference Committee began meeting this week to hash out the different versions of budgets passed by the Assembly and the Senate. Conference Committee members are Senators Mark Leno (Chair), Ricardo Lara, Jim Nielsen; and Assemblymembers Shirley Weber (Vice-Chair), Richard Bloom, and Melissa Melendez. Read ACHD's support letter for items under consideration by the Conference Committee here.

The Conference Committee began meeting on Monday, June 1 and started its work by examining the health and human services budget items. The Legislature continues to struggle over restoring Medi-Cal cuts that occurred in 2011, including benefit and rate cuts. Significant items included:

- Restoration of adult dental benefits Senator Leno identified this as a top priority for Senate
 Democrats. Adult dental benefits were partially restored on in 2014, but excluded many services.
 The Senate proposal would restore partial dentures, root canals, laboratory-processed crowns,
 periodontics and implants. The item has \$66.8 million General Fund cost. The Committee held
 the item open.
- Medi-Cal Coverage Regardless of Immigration Status The Senate adopted \$40 million General
 Fund in anticipation of SB 4 becoming state law. The Department of Finance (DOF) has concerns
 with the proposal and noted that county indigent programs can serve this population. The
 Committee held the item open.
 - SB 4 was substantially narrowed coming out of Senate Appropriations to decrease the costs of the bill. Originally, it would have expanded public health care programs (Medi-Cal and Covered California) for undocumented individuals. As amended, SB 4 would allow undocumented minors up to age 19 to enroll in Medi-Cal. It also allows undocumented adults and families with higher incomes to buy non-subsidized coverage through Covered California if the federal government approves it. The author estimated 240,000 minors would sign up for Medi-Cal. The LAO is estimating General Fund costs of \$20-150 million. The measure passed off the Senate floor on June 2 with unanimous Democratic support and two Republican 'aye' votes, Senators Anthony Canella and Andy Vidak, both of the Central Valley.
- Medi-Cal Provider Rates The Senate and Assembly took different actions to increase provider rates and undo portions of the AB 97 (Chapter 3, Statutes of 2011) Medi-Cal provider rate cuts. This item was held open.
 - o The Senate eliminated the ongoing Medi-Cal provider payment reductions for dental provider (\$30 million General Fund) and provided one-time funding to exempt half of the



- collection of the AB 97 retroactive recoupments in 2015-16 for distinct-part nursing facilities (\$6.9 million General Fund).
- The Assembly eliminated the ongoing and active recoupment of AB 97 Medi-Cal provider payment reductions for all providers. Five percent would be restored on April 1, 2016 and the remaining five percent would be restored April 1, 2017. The action did not forgive the distinct-part nursing facilities recoupment. Budget year costs are \$25.4 million General Fund. At full implementation, this proposal costs \$233 million General Fund.
- County Administration Funding for Medi-Cal Eligibility The two houses took the same actions to provide an additional \$31 million General Fund (\$95.3 million total) above the May Revision for county administration of Medi-Cal. However, this item was before Conference Committee because the Assembly also adopted budget bill language allowing DOF to augment county eligibility funding during the budget year if additional savings are identified. The Committee approved the Assembly language.

There are also a number of high profile budget issues not in Conference Committee that will be hammered out between Democratic leadership and the Governor, including revenue estimates (the Legislature adopted the LAO's estimate of \$3 billion in additional revenues) and Proposition 98 expenditures.

Additionally, the 2015 budget includes \$765 million in funding for pre 2004 local agency mandate claims to cities, counties and special districts. Click here to read the memo sent to Betty Yee, California State Controller, from the Department of Finance outlining the payment details for the state mandate reimbursement payments. Note that each local agency's principal payments are scheduled to be mailed out on June 27, 2015 and actual interest payments will be mailed out in August.

Speakers at the event included Dustin Corcoran (CMA), Senator Ed Hernandez, Carmela Castellano-Garcia (CPCA), Duane Donner (CHA), Dave Regan (SEIU-UHW) and Assembly Member Rob Bonta. The Medi-Cal Matters campaign includes social media, op-eds, and other press strategies. The rally included targeted legislative visits.
